Dear Parishioners:

I am grateful for all your prayers at the time of my surgery and for the many expressions of concern as I begin my period of healing. As best as can be determined at this point, the surgery on my foot went as expected. I will be in a splint and later a regular cast for six to eight weeks. During this time I will not be able to put any weight on my foot, so I will need the assistance of crutches or a wheel chair. This will be followed by another two to four weeks in a postoperative "boot" and therapy. While the "boot" will allow some walking, I will not be able to drive during this entire 10-12 week period. The purpose of this is to replace a torn tendon and to realign the bones in my foot to prevent the "new" tendon from suffering the same fate as the old one. One note: This is not related to the foot injury I suffered in August which required me to wear a similar boot for a short period of time on my left foot. In fact, this time it is the right foot. At least when it is over, I will have a matching pair of those ugly boots.
