This evening, Sunday May 2, 7:30pm at St. Isaac Jogues. The combined choirs of IHM, St. Isaac Jogues and St. Joseph Fullerton along with Brass Quartet, Timpani, Handbells and Organ present: "THE STATIONS OF THE RESURRECTION" The choirs will perform three anthems including the "HALLELUJAH CHORUS" Please join us for a joyful musical and scriptural event as we continue our celebration of the Easter Season.

We will celebrate the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** at the 6 pm Mass on May 8th. We invite all those who are suffering from an acute and/or chronic illness, mental or physical, (including those seeking help for addictions) to receive the Sacrament during this Mass. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick was formerly referred to as "Extreme Unction" because it was usually only administered when someone was in danger of death. While it is expected that those receiving the Sacrament are seeking healing or strength because of a specific and serious illness or illnesses or are preparing for surgery, it is not required that death be immanent for the reception of the sacrament. As it is with all the sacraments (except Baptism), it is expected that those requesting to be anointed have reached the age of reason (about seven years old) in order to have at least a basic understanding of the meaning of the sacrament.
